


Baseline Survey Respondents (n=189)

Which sentence(s) best describe your thoughts on the baseline survey?






A Local Government Guide to the Chesapeake Bay

- Seven educational modules (powerpoint and fact sheet)
- Topics: watershed 101, laws/regulations, economic value, trees, land use, stormwater, workforce development
- 380+ have accessed editable materials
- 1,400+ directly engaged with the materials
- 9,500+ indirectly exposed to the materials
- Launched Phase II
 - Four more educational modules: flooding, agriculture, environmental health, outreach/engagement
 - Online repository to house materials
 - Train the trainer on how to use the materials
