2023 Biennial SRS Meeting

Purpose:

Convene the Partnership to address the Executive Council charge on charting a course to 2025 and beyond and identify the opportunities to apply what we have learned to get us there.

Objectives & Key Questions:

1. Science: Identify recommendations given the key findings from the CESR report.
 - How do we translate the new and emerging scientific data into policy and recommendations?
 - How do we enhance monitoring?
2. Restoration: Address outcome attainability (and non-attainment) and identify priorities and how to address gaps.
 - How do we adjust and adapt our work to address challenges?
 - How do we build on the lessons learned and outcomes from our outcome attainability workshops?
 - How do we leverage opportunities to restore/conservate for multiple benefits?
 - What are our next steps to reach the Watershed Agreement targets and prioritize which outcomes should be met by 2025
3. Partnership: Define our partnership, where we have gaps, and how we can ensure a diverse and robust partnership moving forward.
 - How can we be inclusive of all communities and stakeholders in our work?
 - Are we enabling meaningful action and allocation of partnership resources? Are there opportunities to improve?
 - How do we improve our partnership efforts for the future?

2021 Biennial SRS Meeting

Purpose: Clarify actions and roles for the next two years to meet the Outcomes in the 2014 Chesapeake Bay Watershed Agreement.

Meeting Outcomes:

- 1) Understanding of the [status in meeting the Agreement Outcomes](#), particularly [where we are behind](#) in achieving our targets.
- 2) Incorporation of [new approaches based on what we have learned through the SRS process](#) (e.g., DEIJ, social sciences, local engagement, climate resiliency, and ecosystem services) into the partnership's processes and efforts.)
- 3) Application of additional lessons learned (particularly related to new understanding of science, policy or economics) and best practices in our [future actions in addressing our gaps in progress](#).
- 4) Participants have a [renewed commitment and collective call to action](#) for their [unique roles](#) in achieving the Agreement Outcomes.
