LGAC/Chesapeake Legal Alliance Project (Presenters: Jennifer Starr [LGAC], Mary Clemmensen and Mary Staley [Chesapeake Legal Alliance])  An update on the finding, status, and next steps of the project (see description below), and how this effort can work in tandem with pay-for-success and/or P3-related recommended actions as listed in the Environmental Finance Action Team report:  The Chesapeake Legal Alliance (CLA) is working with the Local Government Advisory Committee (LGAC) to the Executive Council in order to assess the statutory limitations and opportunities expressed in the Environmental Finance Symposium Report Recommendations. Due to the limited scope of support, LGAC members have charged the CLA with diving deeper into the recommendation to reduce unnecessary transaction costs. The CLA will analyze the legal framework around procurement policies within one or two states (Pennsylvania and/or Virginia) and develop a set of findings and recommendations around the feasibility to which local governments are able to implement the recommendation contained in the report. The Alliance's LGAC staff is currently working with the CLA to develop a project framework and scope.
