On behalf of the Delaware delegation of the [Local Government Advisory Committee](#) to the Chesapeake Executive Council (LGAC), I cordially invite you, a local elected official, to join me on the *Wandering Delaware's Waterways*, a one-day peer-to-peer learning exchange focused on exploring the economic benefits of clean water projects.

When: Thursday, October 7, 10:00 am – 3:00 pm

Where: Start your day with some coffee and a walking tour in Seaford, head to Laurel to enjoy lunch at [Abbott's on Broad Creek](#), and end touring the [Ramble](#) along Broad Creek.

Who: Local elected officials who are passionate about helping their communities.

Why: This one-day field trip is an opportunity for you to share your local priorities with other elected officials and learn about the priorities of your peers.

Cost: There is no cost to you. The lunch and tours will be provided for free. We simply ask for a few hours of your time.

This will be a small group of no more than 30 local elected officials. We will have an open discussion about the challenges **YOUR** community faces in addressing clean water goals and share examples of successes and obstacles faced by the other participating officials. By elevating local issues and concerns to state leaders, including Governor Carney, LGAC is a strong and trusted voice for local governments within the Chesapeake Bay Program.

While excursions such as this typically happen together on a bus, due to Covid concerns we are making this a self-drive tour. We are also asking that you consider attending only if you are vaccinated. Masks, except while eating, will be worn. Hand sanitizer will be provided, please monitor yourself for symptoms and do not attend if you are not feeling well. Be sure to dress comfortably and wear walking shoes.
