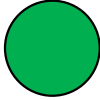
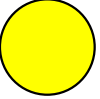
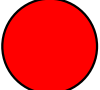

# Planning For Clean Water: Local Government Workshops

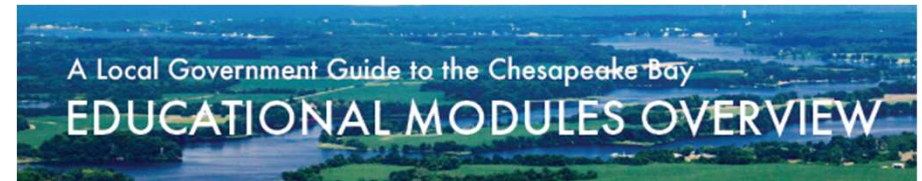
- Project Steps
  - identify local planner needs
  - convene workshops for local government planners
  - amplify impact with presentation
- Local Planner's Situation Assessment
  - based on interviews with local government planning associations
  - identifies top priorities/needs for local planners
  - recommendations for how to engage with local government planners
  - guide for working collaboratively with local planners – useful for feds/states
- Next steps → webinar series this winter with MidAtlantic Planning Collaboration, in-person workshops next summer, national conference session
