

- Connect with invited local and state leaders including State Senator Linwood Loui











- A Local Government Guide to the Chesapeake Bay

  - Project is now complete and final report is on meeting webpage
  - Directly engaged more than 1,500 local officials and indirectly engaged an additional 19,000 local leaders

January 20, 2022: A Planner's Guide to the Chesapeake Bay- This webinar will provide an orientation to the Bay, including geography, population, the Bay Program, why it's important for planners to know about the Bay and how local decision-making impacts water resources. REGISTER NOW.
