2019 Local Government Forum: Workforce Development

Potential Problem Statement:

What are the biggest issues we need to address in this one day forum?

- Demand for workforce? There's been growth in the construction and installation of stormwater management and green infrastructure projects, all in which need adequate maintenance over time to function properly. If not, these projects waste valuable time and resources, and will ultimately fail to address water resource issues.
 Without a trained workforce, the Bay won't meet its water quality and quantity goals. Thus, it is imperative to train workers in operating and maintaining such projects.
- **Supply of jobs?** Even if training programs are in place, do jobs exist? How will trainees go about getting employed? (DC is having this exact issue)
- **Target under/unemployed?** This also provides an opportunity to employ targeted populations often left out of the workforce.

Forum Goal(s)?

- Identify opportunities to build upon and/or replicate existing workforce development models in order to bolster the "green collar" workforce.
- This forum will bring together experts to brainstorm Baywide and/or jurisdiction specific recommendations for expanding existing models and introducing new and innovative workforce development opportunities.
- This forum may also recommend ways in which the Chesapeake Bay Program can support workforce development programs and ensure job opportunities exist once workers are trained.
