- 1:10 Review of Land Use Change Data for CAST-21 Peter Claggett, USGS, and Rachel Soobitsky, Chesapeake Conservancy.

Peter and Rachel presented a prioritized list of identified errors and fixes to the 2013-2017 Land Use Change data. Major fixes include addressing rules so there isn't an over classification of turf as change. This is evident in Peter's tables for the fixed counties, in which there is less of an increase in turf and subsequent decrease in mixed open acres. Some items can't be fixed, like the under detection of forest growth, under classification of bare shore, and over classification of change due to poor quality of parcel and/or LiDAR data. There was discussion about the quality of LiDAR data used for each county (posted here) and if there will be a county scale error report to account for such differences. Peter noted that CIC has not done a county by county error assessment and there are challenges involved with doing so at that scale, but they will be talking with UVM to discuss an overall accuracy assessment. The comparison between CAST-17d, CAST-19 (current version), and CAST-21 for DRAFT data for the 14 counties is posted here.

2:20 <u>Expectations and Future Timeline</u> - KC Filippino, HRPDC, and Karl Berger, Washington Metropolitan Council of Governments.

KC gave an overview of the revised schedule and expectations of the Land Use Workgroup and Water Quality GIT moving forward (posted here). Rachel Soobitsky noted that she will work with Jackie Pickford to send an email to the LUWG every Friday in June once counties are posted to the Viewer. There was a request to provide the associated CSV files. The data posted to the Viewer will be the final product to inform CAST-21, however, the LUWG was encouraged to continue providing feedback to Rachel and Peter if errors are still found. The ultimate decision for the LUWG will be in July, where they will make a recommendation to the WQGIT on whether the measured change data set being developed now should be used for CAST21 in lieu of the current modeled data set for land use.
