A high priority for the Forestry Workgroup is to build state and local capacity through new funding and policy strategies. To help foster those efforts, additional local capacity building, funding streams, partnerships and policy tools are needed to counteract all the tree canopy losses occurring from development, pests and diseases, storms, and other factors. B. Land Use Methods and Metrics (February QPM) (1:05 p.m. – 1:30 p.m.) Land cover data are foundational, authoritative, and transformative to the Bay restoration effort because they inform most 2014 Agreement outcomes and will ultimately change the way restoration and conservation actions are implemented. And, they help establish accurate trends in impervious cover, forests, and tree canopy to enable the CBP Partners to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of stormwater and forest management activities.
