

# Principals Staff Committee Meeting March 2, 2022

## **Actions/Decisions**

#### **Phase 7 Timeline and Priorities**

Decision: The PSC agreed to elongate the Phase 7 model development timeline by 2 years.

<u>Action</u>: The Modeling workgroup will develop a one-pager to meet the needs of communicating the reason for this change to the Phase 7 Model. It will emphasize that this change is not a delay of achieving the WIPs or 2025 goals.

<u>Note</u>: Ann Swanson asked for a one-page summary and timeline to explain how the changes will play out.

## **Monitoring Funding Needs Analysis**

<u>Action:</u> The final Monitoring Funding Needs Report will be shared with the PSC, MB and the rest of the CBP partnership once completed-- expected by the end of March 2022.

<u>Note:</u> The Monitoring Team and CBP staff will scope out the idea of a retreat (charette or similar type meeting) and possible participants to discuss funding priorities and sources at a decision-making level.

## **Infrastructure Funding Updates**

Note: Congress has not yet finalized the spending bills for FY 2022 and federal agencies continue to work under a continuing resolution (at 2021 levels). The EPA is expected to receive \$47.6 billion per year for five years through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. Details on allocations and funding have not been disclosed by the EPA Office of the Chief Financial Office; however, EPA continues its planning. CBPO is working on reviewing comments provided by the jurisdiction as they reviewed the draft grant guidance for FY22 and hopes to issue guidance by the end of March 2022.

## **Update on Executive Council Climate Change Directive**

<u>Note:</u> The small CBPO-led team continues to develop a crosswalk between the state climate action plans, that have been completed as appropriate by Partnership jurisdictions, and the October 2021 Climate Directive. A team member or Management Board representative will provide an update at the next PSC meeting.

# **Advisory Committee Recommendations to the Executive Council**

Action: The PSC agreed to have the Management Board be the lead partnership body to respond to the CBP Advisory Committees' 2021 Recommendations to the Executive Council. Copies of the draft response letters will be provided to the Management Board for review and comments by Tuesday, March 14.

# Outcome Attainability: Accelerating Progress on Forest Buffers and Wetlands

<u>Note:</u> The small group organizing the Wetlands Workshop is looking for a PSC-level champion to help promote the workshop and encourage high-level partners to attend.

The Forest Buffers Workshop has been scheduled for April 27, 2022. Two pre-workshop webinars focused on technical assistance and conservation are also being planned. Sec. Cindy Dunn (PA) agreed to serve as a lead sponsor of the workshop and sent a letter to PSC members to encourage high-level participation.

## **Executive Council Meeting Planning**

<u>Action</u>: The Principals' Staff Committee agreed to re-convene the EC Meeting Planning Committee to start discussing themes and possible major actions for a mid-late September EC meeting. Rachel Felver will reach out to potential participants from each partner.

<u>Note:</u> The Executive Council Meeting Planning Committee Staff are scheduling the first 2022 EC planning meeting for Wednesday, March 30 at 3 pm.

## **Conowingo WIP Update:**

<u>Note:</u> The EPA's CWIP Evaluation was released on January 25, 2022, and found that the current lack of support for alternative funding provides no confidence that load reductions will be achieved by 2025. Jurisdictions are working together to specify their CWIP financing commitments with the 60-day timeline set by EPA to respond to the no confidence assessment. Meanwhile the core group is developing a more detailed workplan and are updating their timeline to implement the 2-year milestones.
